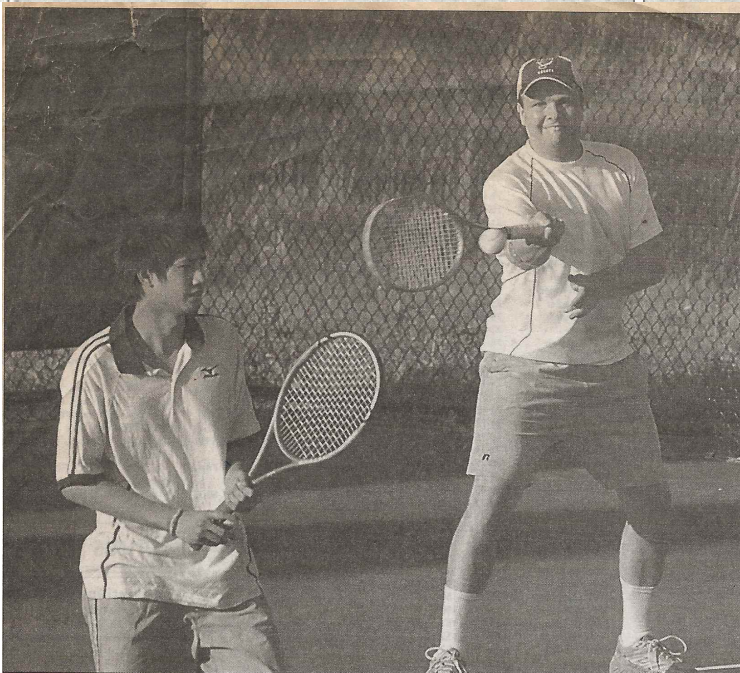
As the AACTA's youth tournament wrapped up Friday, the adults took to the Varsity Tennis Center courts.

Yang brothers, Chang, Chung excel in junior tennis meet

Not you again. And again. And again. And again.

The four best boys 16-under players at the Ann Arbor Area Community Tennis Association junior tournament were Kevin Chang, Yeon Woo Chung and brothers Daniel and Douglas Yang - but they proved their mettle in different ways Friday at the University of Michigan's Varsity Tennis Center.

Chung and Chang beat Yang and Yang in the doubles final, 6-3, 6-3, but in singles, Daniel Yang stopped Chang 6-1, 6-2 to win the title.

Chang prevented an all-Yang singles final by beating Douglas Yang 6-4, 6-1 in one semifinal, while Daniel Yang - Douglas' Huron High School teammate - had a battle on his hands in beating Chung in the other semifinal 4-6, 6-3, 10-7.

Chung, Chang and Daniel Yang won two of the 10 finals that were played Friday.

Doubles finals are Sunday at U-M's Varsity Tennis Center

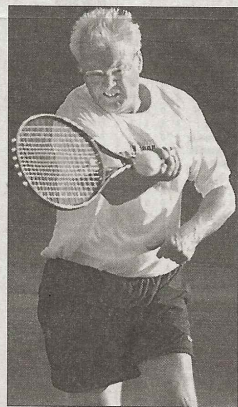
Friday's winners will face seeded opponents at 9 a.m. today in the round of 16.
