## Brazil champ aims for city title

Petreca, No. 1 seed in Ann Arbor event, does juggling act

Victor Petreca's morning was stressful enough without having to deal with a change of competitive scenery.

Steady rain on Saturday temporarily moved the Ann Arbor City Singles Tennis Tournament indoors – the last place Petreca wanted to be while making his bid for a berth in today's semifinals.

Before playing, the top seed in the men's open division already had made a hurried airport run to pick up his mother, Marly, who arrived late from Brazil to see her son play for the first time in five years.

So when the skies cleared again, moving play back outdoors at the University of Michigan's Varsity Tennis Center, Petreca – who spent his entire junior career playing on clay – couldn't have been more relieved.

"I was like, 'Thank God,' " Petreca said after knocking off Austin Taylor 6-1, 6-1 in the men's open quarterfinals.

Petreca last played in the tournament in 2006, when he reached the open finals, finishing as the runner-up.

Now, with only a semester remaining at Eastern Michigan University, Petreca plays tennis once a month while adjusting to married life and preparing for medical school.

Despite the infrequency of his play, Petreca's skills haven't diminished. An accomplished Brazilian junior champion, Petreca used a powerful baseline game to advance.

And while he entered the city championships for fun, Petreca's competitive past wouldn't allow him to fully enjoy himself.

"In my head, I still think the way I used to think when I was 16, but my body doesn't execute," Petreca said. "But I've gone from practicing four hours a day to playing once a month. So it's different."

David Seyferth knows the feeling.
